On-going Business

- o Jennifer Cook spoke about the School of Spiritual Enrichment and if anyone had any concerns that it should be run and managed by CommPres or as a separate entity. Session discussed this issue and felt it should stay under the umbrella of the Church for now with the option of operating as a separate entity later if needed.
- o Allison Lyman reported on Soul Care, that we have 8 new commissioned Stephen Ministers. Congregational Care that visits hospital, congregational members, etc. is starting up soon.

- Bruce Carlson updated Session on the new building construction.
March Update: We are approximately 2 weeks behind schedule due to masonry workers and truss delivery schedule. ARNCO will make every effort to get back on track.

April Update: We have a schedule crisis due to shortage of masonries, truss supplier and unforeseen structural design. Must switch to "Plan B" for start of pre-school. The pre-school could be 2 weeks to a month late in opening in new building. ARNCO will begin working overtime to try to close the gap.
- George Crippen stated that we have two new full-time staff personnel. Bronwyn Crowe, Administrative Assistant, will be at the front desk and Devon Martin, our new Facilities Operations Associate will be all around making sure the building is well maintained.
