SENIOR PASTOR REPORT

We had a historic year of ministry! We literally had thousands of people on the campus for numerous events!

We baptized 46 people, with a special Baptism Sunday were 32 people got baptized via immersion that morning! We added 64 new members to our church as well.

Our special events included: a new addition to Holy Week with Jesus not only serving communion at the Last Supper table but dying on the cross! The Summer Family days: Potlucks, BBQ and Burger Bash with big water slides for the kids created a sense of fellowship throughout the summer...not to mention the Fall Festival and Woof-tacular that brought large numbers of visitors to the campus. Our Pumpkin Patch continued to become more spiritually oriented with the Prayer Pumpkin and Thanksgiving tree. We added a Halloween night ministry that had 8,000 come through our gates!

The Bethlehem Experience brought 6,000 people to hear about God's Christmas Gift of salvation through the arrival of Jesus Christ. We handed out 300 Bibles, invited people to accept Jesus, brought in a Spanish speaking team to minister to the many Latino visitors. It was moving to see so many people raise their hands to invite Jesus into their lives—especially little children.

One of the priorities this year was a new Discipleship program which Executive Director Tracy Mattes devised. As our society becomes increasingly secular with an anti- God attitude, the most effective way for Christians to influence the world is to be intentional about their faith. Tracy also launched a 24 hout prayer day that evolved into an ongoing prayer team.

We placed more emphasis on social media in order to communicate our message more effectively. Our staff is a team of experts in their field of ministry. The emphasis of the team is Inviting people to enter into a relationship with Jesus.

A special shout out goes to Elder Sara Turner who orchestrated much needed improvements to our A/C and other church facilities!

Our church ministry received over \$1.6 million for the year. The new people showing up, the meaningful worship, the activities and spiritual atmosphere cause us to be thankful for God's presence and favor resting upon our church.

Reading demographic studies regarding the church in America our church is in rare air. The vast majority of the 365,000 Protestant churches in the US are much smaller than CPC. Our goal is to continue to strive to be relevant in the new world evolving around us. I am proud of our congregation!



The stage was literally set for an underwater celebration by the hard-working VBS Stage Set team, and 39 children asked Jesus to be their Lord and Savior. Parents had the most wonderful things to say and it was a blessing to watch God move.

During the first and second phases of Strategic Discipleship, the elementary-aged kids met inMission: DISCIPLE and learned the same elements that the adult groups were exploring. Each week, the adult lesson was transformed it into kid-friendly games, activities, and Bible learning, all with a secret agent theme. Our mission, of course, was to learn what it means to be a kid who follows Jesus!

JANUARY - JUNE 2024

The year 2024 was a year filled with God's protection, teamwork and love.

There were a total of 16 all day students, 32 VPK students and 28 three-year-old students. January began in-house registration for our students, and we continued to register those on our waitlist throughout February. In March, registration opened to the public.

The 2023/24 school year ended with our annual four-year-old preschool graduation program in the Church sanctuary. Following the program Church Dog handed out books and took photos with the graduates while the preschool staff hosted fellowship time outside on the church lawn with family and friends. On the last day of school bibles were given out to the students who were moving on to kindergarten.

The staff joined me throughout the summer (after Preschool VBS) to set up the classrooms to welcome students and families to our open house.

AUGUST - DECEMBER 2024

The 2024/2025 school year began on August 12, 2024. Weekly emails are sent to highlight upcoming events, information regarding classroom activities and an invitation to join church services in person or online and times of services are listed. The preschool Instagram is updated throughout the week with photos and videos.

There is a total of 17 students that stay in our extended day program, 35 VPK/4 yr. old students and 21 three-year-old students.

STUDENT EXPERIENCE

Each week of the school year includes a well-balanced Christian curriculum that encourages creative expression, learning through play, handwriting, prayer time, bible stories and discussions. In addition to providing a safe and caring learning environment, our staff carry out the goal of our preschool ministry by sharing the love of Jesus with the children of this community and its surroundings.



SPECIAL EVENTS

- All students visited our on-campus pumpkin patch with their teachers. They all received a pumpkin and a visit with Miss Vicky who did age-appropriate themed experiments.
- Our annual costume parade took place outside in the area between the church and Life Building with treats for all our students which included preschool and church staff participation.

 celebrate Christmas...Jesus' Birthday!







TRAINING

Our staff completed their mandatory 10 hours of training which included CPR, AED and First Aid certification. The VPK teachers were required to pass CLASS assessments by the ECL coalition and continue to achieve high results.

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Wednesday Nights are for our Middle and High School Students. Growing from 5 High Schoolers to averaging 25. Middle School, 25.


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Sunday School

Our church has been supporting missionaries Debbie Scott-Robinson and her husband, Paul Robinson since 2015 for the orphanage they began in Kenya Africa in 2009. They started bringing hope of a future for children in the area with the orphanage and Feed 500 program and have now grown into providing Christian 4-year high school education for 260 needy children as well as mental and physical health care to the village. Twelve sponsored students graduated from the newly developed 1-year Bible College in 2023 and successfully traveled to spread the Good News to others. Donations have provided for replacement of the original outdoor charcoal fire pot and dirt seating areas with building an indoor kitchen and dining area for CHS staff and students. Visions include growing the Bible College, developing a technical training school for teaching and equipping students with more useful skills for further success.

BALANCE SHEET:

Un-restricted cash decreased by \$48,600 from 2023 primarily due to the paydown and refinance of Loan A in July 2024. The Capital Reserve Fund has a balance of \$15,821. This fund was established to ensure we can pay for larger repair and maintenance items, such as A/C, roof, etc. The 2024 Operating Budget includes an annual budget of \$48,000 for Capital Reserves.

OPERATIONS:

The year 2024 was marked by numerous blessings for CommPres. Through the generosity of one of our congregation members, we successfully refinanced our maturing mortgage at a lower rate, and notably, without incurring a lien. Additionally, The Bethlehem Experience drew thousands of visitors to our church, and thanks to continued donations throughout the year, this remarkable event came at no cost to CommPres.

We also made significant improvements to our facilities, including the long-awaited replacement of the large HVAC unit, funded through our Capital Reserve, with no impact on our operating budget. In a further demonstration of financial stewardship, we invested a portion of our funds into a higher-interest CD prior to paying down our mortgage, resulting in an impressive \$8,400 in interest income over budget for 2024.

Thanks to the ongoing support of our congregation and a generous donor, we were also able to begin remodeling our third floor to create a dedicated space for our Children's Ministry, setting the stage for even greater impact in the future.

As we move into 2025, we are excited about the continued growth of our congregation, the expansion of our life groups, children's and youth ministries, and deepening spiritual journeys through our discipleship programs. We look forward to another year of growth, impact, and blessings.


